Shamefully he resorts to schemes to boost attendance and impress his beliefs on villagers. He schedules a tent revival at the church just to keep people from going to an outside event. BUT at the —

general store: A FEMALE OWNER vows to save them from "that church." She's betting on television to help and she's got the latest color set in stock. She offers free tea at her table in exchange for the latest "information," she might be able to use. WHILE over at the —

WIFE dabbles in pop culture finding herself striking a balance when compromise is lost. She stands up for her kids when a travelling EVANGELIST tries to smash their TV set. Her nine-year-old HYPERACTIVE SON brings progressive ideas home causing rules and situations to be reevaluated. He sneaks around a lot, getting into places like the —

Oirport: with parachute club and two runways. TWO BOARD MEMBERS continually plot against the minister. They'd rather see him gone, but their conscience gets in the way sometimes. And so does —







fire station: A FIREMAN/CONSTABLE who keeps an eye on them and the female store owner. He's suspicious of any woman in authority. He wants her removed from the town council.

homes: crawl down a single sidewalk. Farms nearby. At first glance, it's a Thomas Kincade painting, yet behind the white picket fences, its residents hold secrets like the history of the town. VILLAGERS think they still live in the conservative 1950's. BUT –

Neorby: America's "most educated city," Ann Arbor lies five miles south. Salem's youth find no shortage of adventure there. AND WHEN stuck in town —

Visitors: Odd travelers make their way down Six Mile Road, holding people hostage, taking over church services, burning buildings and crashing airplanes. — All true stories.

symbolically to enter/depart our world, was the site of Michigan's deadliest rail disaster (1907.) Instead, it takes us back to four seasons in time, 1971 – 1975.



character arcs: span the season to keep us watching, while each week's main plot anchors as a stand-alone episode challenging villagers to solve a crisis — as we peek into a historic humanity that is so much like present day.

the series: Already saved: sixty (60) righteous episode ideas, half-a-dozen bad outlines, and five groovy screenplay drafts — all ready to boogie.

Pilot: Smash the hell-e-vison

REVEREND EVAN SMITH wants to be the next Billy Graham. But he hides a dark secret from his youth -- the night he promised God that he would reach as many people as Graham if his drunken father was removed from his life. A crusade is coming to nearby Detroit and villagers want to go, but Evan won't hear of it because he's afraid they might discover he steals Graham's sermons.


Store owner BARBRA DONAVAN is determined to sell the latest television model from her store – an upgrade from *black and white*. Hoping to boost sales, she's willing to loan it to the church so people can watch Graham in living color. Nielsen ratings looks to shore up representation in the town and all the women want to be the chosen household.

Concerned he'll get caught; Evan concocts a story that the church was already planning on a "tent revival" meeting that week. His scheme brings in an evangelist whose "smash the hell-e-vision" campaign divides families. Evan is pushed to choose between keeping a promise to the evangelist or supporting his family.

character deep dive



pastor evan smith

EVAN SMITH (40): The minister of the Salem Church dresses up in a shirt and tie, stands tall, and is concerned about putting on a good face. His thin, muscular physic looks more suited for basketball than the football team he played on at Wheaton College. His short dark hair and model airplane collection hints that he is involved in the Civil Air Patrol. He works out. Appearance is critical.

His lower-middle-class upbringing ingrained experiences that allow him to relate to the simple people of Salem. Like in the episode "Christmas Lump." We'll go back to his childhood when he made a model airplane to give to a "poor" family only to discover the "needy" kid had more toys than all his sisters put together.

Always eager to help anyone in need, sometimes he forgets how things may impact his family at home, like in the episode "Labor Day Contest" when his events hijack time he should spend with his son. While this may seem simplistic, it is a mirror of the neglect his own father (an abusive drunk) showed.

He aspires to be the next Billy Graham. He is faced with the dilemma of bringing everyone into the fold, for he believes that "if he can't save a small village like Salem, he will never move onto anything bigger." His desire to help others is driven by his internal need for atonement haunted by a past prayer for his father to be removed. He suppresses his emotions like he does his past. His persistence assures he'll be back again to reach villagers who are divided about living in a past era or moving forward.



barbra donavan

General Store Owner: Coming of age in an upper-middle class family, BARBRA DONAVAN dresses well, speaks in a highfalutin manner, and is somewhat pretentious. Late thirties and owner of the General Store, Barbra's ambitions collide with Evan's goals abundantly.

While she is tight with money, she loves playing hostess and offers free goodies to buy the latest "news" from those who hang out at her tea table. She is a master at manipulating the ladies in the town.

Not a churchgoer, she believes religion is about power. Why would she think differently with a father who had their church's minister on "his payroll?" She leads people to believe her family is more prestigious than is true. She is chairwoman of the Town Council, a position she secretly equates as being mayor of the village, as seen in the episode "*Electing Warren*."

More than anything she wants to prove to her father that a "woman" can be successful. She has dreams of branching her General Store and believes if she were allowed more freedom (like opening on Sunday's or selling beer and wine) she could ring-up enough cash to accomplish this. She has grand plans for expansion in Salem, except "that church" seems to always be in opposition to her goals. But she has plans on how to overcome that,



loretta smith

LORETTA SMITH: As Pastor's wife, mother, and former missionary, she runs the household behind the scenes. At 40, she is fashion conscious, can't miss her weekly appointment at the beauty parlor, and excels at putting on a stylish appearance. Underneath the makeup, there is a tomboy at heart.

Growing up during the depression era, as the middle child of three and mostly ignored, she knows how to survive.

She'll have a lot to deal with in the episode "Christmas Lump" when she is diagnosed with breast cancer.

Her experiences, as a teacher and missionary overseas, help bring a real-world balance to people who otherwise might be isolated in this church-going community.

Many times, she brings an opposing view to the table and makes us think. This is nailed in the pilot episode "Smash the Hell-e-vision."

Her biggest obstacle is her love for her children. David can do the unforgivable and to her "he's just being a kid." When disagreements with Evan arise, sometimes the only way for her to get his attention is to create a small drama and act like she is hurt more than real. She does this in the episode "Labor Day Contest."



david smith

DAVID SMITH: A nine-year-old boy who gets into everything, a bit of a nerd, he is always trying to fit in with the cool people, though usually only accepted because "he's the minister's son." His insight into some situations inspire progressive change.

He's growing up in a middle-class home that has all the amenities of the 70s. But his parents hardly indulge and typically limit his freedom to explore adventures they think are influentially sinful. This means hanging at his buddy's house just to watch TV or sneak to the movies.

David is bratty and adventurous; yet has a level head. His simple ideas make sense, sometimes helping, and other times causing issues. His curiosity, as seen in "Labor Day Contest," is always getting him into situations and schemes where his initial selfish ambition is turned sideways to help a neighbor. He is learning a lot.



mary ann baker

MARY ANN BAKER: Bart Baker's 17-year old daughter and David's arch nemesis, dresses like Samantha on Bewitched down to the mini skirt, knee socks and hairdo. But why wouldn't she, it is her favorite show?

She aspires to be a teacher. Having graduated a year early, she took a volunteer position as a teaching assistant with her mentor at the high school. Her liberal co-workers have her curious about what is in the world, thus she sneaks off to Ann Arbor for new experiences whenever she can.

She is not timid to jump in and say something when others may not. Her progressive values swing at some of the more conservative ideals in town. She is always suspect of David and his shenanigans like the time in "Labor Day Contest" when he tried to use MDA's materials to set up a carnival and keep the money for himself.



warren rodgers

kate rodgers

At forty-five, **WARREN RODGERS** sports a crew cut. He wears camouflage or slacks and a button-down shirt most of the time, maybe a tie on Sundays.

From a middle-class family in Indiana, Warren set out for bigger adventures in the auto industry. He did well, making it into upper management. While growing up, his father was a police officer and his uncle a firefighter. While certified as neither, in a village the size of Salem, that qualifies Warren to do both.

He left the auto industry and suburbs of Detroit, shocked by the drinking and womanizing at parties he was expected to attend. He took his family and headed for the simple life in quiet Salem. He'll use his power and influence to keep the town that way.

He enjoys working on church vehicles and uses his management talents serving on the board. We see this in the pilot "Smash the Hell-e-vision." Warren loves Salem. He gets to call most of the shots here. Evan is his pal, because the two of them usually agree.

Stay-at-home mom who has three boys, KATE RODGERS (44) spends her free time socializing at the infamous "tea table." Laid back, she thinks nothing about strutting around town with curlers still in her hair.

From middle-class Indiana, she grew up expecting to be a housewife. While her expectations came true, sometimes she misses the excitement in the big city that Warren took her away from.

Her world is making her boys happy and to her that means keeping up with all the gossip in town. She sews. She bakes. She gardens. She is involved in the Ladies Aid. But she would rather watch TV than clean, and she's determined to be the house chosen by Nielsen in the pilot, "Smash-the-Hell-e-vision."





alex gold

You'd never guess forty-two-year-old ALEX GOLD is an accountant with his beard that looks like Ringo Star's, though its trimmed better. His analytical facial expression makes one think he is ready to adamantly object.

From an upper-middle class Kansas family and with a masters from University of Michigan, he is the CFO of a small business that makes plastic parts for automobiles. He drives the latest model Oldsmobile and frequently rents a Cessna at the Salem airport for recreation on Saturdays.

Not wishing for his girls to grow up under the social influences of Ann Arbor, he bought a house in Salem. His business went on to purchase a second location, a plant a block away.

Alex serves on the church board as treasurer. He believes the man who controls the finances controls all. This causes conflict with Evan enough times, that he plots to stack the board against him. He harbors a secret desire to replace Evan altogether. He's used to getting his way.

lance singer

Except in church, LANCE SINGER (40) conceals his balding head under a hat that looks more fit for a train conductor than a farmer. He dresses in overalls during the week but spares no expense on suits for Sunday morning church.

Lance (along with his mother and son) lives in the run-down house where he was born and raised. The old house holds memories he'd rather forget. This directs his spending on the latest machinery and upkeep for the farm instead. The contrast is obvious in the pilot, "Smash the Hell-e-vision."

He once had dreams of becoming a singer, but alcohol took its toll and his wife left him. He's always been insecure where family is concerned and when one son ran away, he started lavishing a better salary on the other (Nick, 20) even buying him a new Tran-Am. After watching an evangelist on TV, his "come to Jesus moment" helped him clean up his act. Using his talents at the Salem Church he is a beloved youth leader and choir director. Serving on the church board, he has intuition on how to move things forward.


